Also, during fair week, Pat and I volunteered to work at one of the food booths recently purchased by Shalom Christian Academy. In coordination with Dave Coldsmith, we renovated the conference room in Galbreath Hall. The Corn Fest is always something to look forward to, parking cars and, this year, handing out cold bottled water as people returned to their vehicles. Each year, the month of July sets aside one day for National Hot Dog Day; something I always enjoy doing is cooking hot dogs for the local community, which, again, was held at Grace Place Gardens.

As I look back, it is hard to count how many home visits I made during 2024. However, I presided over three funerals or celebrations of life, as I would like to conclude. I presided over one wedding, led an adult small group class on Sunday mornings, joined the Shippensburg Campus Ministry Council, joined the Board of Directors with CCO, a partner at Shippensburg University, helping campus ministry to love and disciple college students. I also serve on the Shippensburg Ministerium and the board of Love Our Town. I also served on a board with SAMC, reviewing applications from high school students vying for two \$500.00 scholarships for first-year students.

There was plenty more activity as I attended Pastor Appreciation Day(s) at Shalom Christian Academy and Cumberland Valley Christian School. Earlier in the year, Patti and I attended ECO's National Gathering in Greenville, South Carolina. I have had monthly meetings with other pastors, the honorably retired and good friend Rev. Meagan Boozer and colleague Rev. Wayne Lowe.

I could go on and on for many pages about what this past year entailed; however, I have learned that lengthy reports often get lost in the shuffle. I will end with this: I am thankful to be here. In all honesty, I do frequently think about retirement and what I would do with extra time on my hands. But for now, along with the Holy Spirit by my side, I look forward to moving this body of believers into a new light with renewed minds, all for the glory of our Father in Heaven.

Christian Education Annual Report 2024

Knowing and loving the gift of God's Word to us is the driving force that keeps those who volunteer to teach in His church faithful throughout the years. We truly love sharing the wonderful stories found in the Bible with the students who come to us, providing opportunities for fellowship and growth throughout the year. Our Sunday morning Small Groups meet at 9:15 AM each week. Our children, ages $4-5^{th}$ grade, explore the Old and New Testaments using Lois Keffler's All Together Now series, published by Group. Through stories, games, treats, and discussion we dig deeper into God's Word, learning how to apply the lessons found there to our daily lives. Our youth, grades 6 through 12, continue to grapple with topics such as anger, contentment, and gratitude using biblically based lessons by minibiblelessons.com.

Adult Small Group also meets at this time and over the past year has covered many topics and studies including a study of the Book of Genesis, Max Lucado's What Happens Next, as well as special studies during the Lenten and Advent seasons.

Our Women's Small Group Study continues to meet monthly. We are now in our 3rd year. Our meeting time has moved from an evening study afternoons at 1:00 PM. Throughout the year we have studied the Prayers of Jesus and are currently using Max Lucado's <u>Ten Women of the Bible</u> as our curriculum. Rahab, Mary, Abigail, Esther and more...they each teach us of God's great plan and of His grace and purpose for our lives.

In addition to our regular studies, we've gathered to celebrate:

- The Lenten season with special studies.
- Easter, with an Easter morning breakfast together and special treats for our children.
- Super Summer Sunday Specials our summer small group program for children from June through July.
- Christian Education Sunday, September 8, with commissioning of our teachers for the 2024

 2025 school year and presentation of Bibles to 2-year-old Clara Heeter and 2nd grader
 Rodney Heeter.
- Advent, with studies for all ages and calendars for our children to guide us through the special season.
- Christmas Breakfast, always a delicious and filling treat and a time of fellowship, on Sunday, December 22. Children in the church family received Christmas gift bags that day also.

There were no applications received for Summer Camp Scholarships this year.

By the Grace of God and the congregation's generous support, the Outreach Committee was able to meet all our planned budget commitments, as listed on the attached 2024 Benevolence Budget.

Congregation-wide community projects the committee sponsored this year included:

- Several people from the committee and congregation met in the Community Room for a light meal and to pack approximately 75 shoe boxes for Samaritan's Purse Operation Shoebox.

2024- 2025 Annual Report from Facilities and Grounds

This year we focused on several projects to improve and maintain the appearance and functioning of our buildings:

Electrical Projects:

- 1.) Ceiling Lights were installed in Galbreath basement all hooked to one light switch, so all lights turn on at one time.
- 2.) New LED lights were installed in the Church basement where Christmas decorations are stored.
- 3.) Fixed lights in the Elevator
- 4.) Reinstalled Emergency lights in the basement
- 5.) The old florescent lights behind stain glass windows and in the attic were replaced with LED lights. The lights were set to match the brightness of the stain glass windows in the sanctuary.
- 6.) Electrician completed all outside lights on the Annex, Galbreath and the Church All lights on the outside exits of the Church have been replaced Lattice room motion detection lights installed, receptacle in Courtyard installed

Plumbing Projects:

- 1.) Sump pump replaced in Church basement
- 2.) Boiler inspections were completed on the heating systems in the Church

Renovation Projects:

- 1.) Painted Galbreath Conference Room
- 2.) Painted Community / Gathering Room
- 3.) Clean up and organization in the Lattice Room (back of the Church)
- 4.) All sidewalks around the Church, Galbreath and Annex were power washed.
- 5.) All Carpets cleaned in the Church, Galbreath and the Annex

Purchases:

- 1.) Adjustable wooden organ bench was installed Church from Mark Cooley's business by Dave and Ken
- 2.) The refrigerator for Coffee time (upstairs Gathering Room) was purchased and installed in October.

Grounds/Flower Bed:

1.) Thanks to Karen Miller for planting the beautiful flowers in the flower bed outside the Church Office (Galbreath).

Thank you to Marty Carmack, Tom Shenk and Pastor Gary for all their help this year. Their willingness to help repair and get projects done at the Church was greatly appreciated.
